
School Uniform

Room 25 has had a great first semester! We enjoyed going to the STEAM building where we made animals using 2D shapes and used the OSMO kits to practice counting and capital letters. We used paints and different textiles to create wonderful art pieces with our Art teacher. In Term 2 Room 25 went on weekly excursions to Inflatable World and swimming. We worked with our wonderful Occupational Therapist and Speech Pathologist where we read story books about our emotions and the weather, and practiced our fine motor skills and used different types of exercise equipment. We imitated actions such as clapping, stomping, and rolling our arms during the Astronaut Program.



What a term it's been! NB3 has been buzzing with hands-on learning, proud achievements and plenty of smiles. Our students have thrown themselves into every part of the curriculum and continue to grow in confidence and independence.

SUBJECT SPOTLIGHT

Maths

We've had so much fun exploring numbers and shapes this term! Students strengthened their addition and subtraction skills through games, number lines and real-life problem-solving. In Geometry, we investigated 2D and 3D shapes by sorting, building and comparing their features—like sides, corners, edges, and faces. A class favourite was our "Guess the Shape" game, where students used clues to identify mystery shapes.

Writing

This term we tackled a variety of text types. With support, students wrote step-by-step procedures like "How to Make a Pizza" and "How to Brush Your Teeth." They also created recounts of exciting events like Cultural Day and their weekends. More recently, students began researching and writing informative texts about animals ahead of our upcoming zoo visit.

SPECIAL HIGHLIGHTS

CULTURAL DAY

Students "travelled" the world in one day, making dumplings in China, decorating boomerangs in Australia and making pizzas in Italy. It was a colourful and joyful celebration, honouring the diversity of our class and the many cultures that make up our school community.

LOCAL WALKS

A weekly favourite! Students practised road safety around the neighbourhood, caught the bus, and visited Coles, where they followed visual shopping lists to buy ingredients for our cooking sessions. These real-world experiences have helped build life skills, confidence, and independence, and the pride they show during these outings is incredible.

LATER YEARS-D

This semester in the D-Wing, our Later Years students have been actively engaged in a wide range of activities both inside and outside the classroom. Students showcased their creativity by making heartfelt gifts for Mother's Day and celebrated Education Week by exploring multiculturalism through arts and crafts, creating flags that represent their diverse backgrounds. They also enjoyed several exciting excursions, including visits to Don Bosco, PIT Gymnastics, bowling, Bounce, Hoops City, park visits, Lalor Neighbourhood House for mural painting and gardening, SYN FM Radio, sailing at Docklands, and trips to Melbourne Central. In addition to their academic efforts, students took on important school-wide jobs such as laundry, resourcing, distributing stationery, managing cleaning products, and handling sensory orders, all of which help foster responsibility and community spirit. Students were also very enthusiastic about their learning across all subjects, including PE, ASDAN, and the new addition to classroom programs: Resilience, Rights, and Respectful Relationships.

With a few students graduating this year, we've placed a strong emphasis on work experience opportunities this term. Notably, several students have participated in our work experience program at Brunswick Industries in Reservoir, where they have developed practical workplace skills every Tuesday. Their tasks have included packaging small boxes, sorting and folding laundry, labelling products, and assisting in the liquid fill department. Students also attended Sports for All work experience at Thomastown, where they were responsible for packing sports boots and recycling sporting equipment, including sorting and packing items into boxes. Further, these experiences have broadened their exposure to real-world environments, building their confidence and providing meaningful insight into future employment possibilities.

We are especially excited about the new building, which offers dedicated spaces for learning and new jobs and roles for students to explore. The upgraded laundry area now features more equipment, allowing students to gain hands-on experience with various tasks, while the spacious indoor gym provides a ready space for physical activities and programs. These new facilities will support students in developing valuable life and work skills in a modern, supportive environment. We are incredibly proud of our students' hard work, positive attitudes, and willingness to embrace new challenges. Everyone is thrilled for the upcoming semester and looking forward to another round of fun-filled activities and engaging learning experiences!
