Message from the VSBA

As you may be aware, the Victorian School Building Authority (VSBA) has been working on a project that will plan for the long-term redevelopment of our site, including the Northern School for Autism campus plus the facilities used by Lalor and District's Men's Shed and the University of the Third Age.

As well as creating a long-term plan for the whole site, the project will upgrade the facilities at Peter Lalor Secondary College.

These works will commence at Peter Lalor SC in the coming month. Early works will include some site set up and preparation, followed by the excavation, services connection, groundworks and construction of the building slab. The structural framework will then be installed and covered. It is anticipated the upgrade will be completed in late 2023.

The highest priority for our school and the Department of Education and Training is the safety of all students travelling to and from school, and while at school.

I have been in close discussion with the VSBA and can confirm there will be minimal impacts on students and their families. Student drop off and pickup will also remain unaffected by construction.

Any works on this site must also comply with Covid Safe Guidelines and the *Workplace (Additional Industry Obligations) Directions*, to the extent that they apply at the time of the works.

I will continue to provide updates as necessary to ensure our community are updated as the project progresses.

Room 4

It has been a fantastic start to the year for Room 4. The students have been settling in their new environment. They have been learning classroom routines and getting to know the different areas of the school.

Room 4 have been engaging in a range of activities that include Literacy, Numeracy, Music, Art, Attention to Autism, Trampoline and a weekly STEAM building visit.

During Art Sessions we have been exposing the students to a variety of materials. They are doing a great job creating their Art pieces. This week we have been creating Easter hats to wear for our upcoming Easter Hat Parade.

ROOM 22

Students in room 22 have had a great start to the year with lots of engaging and exciting activities. They have been enjoying their weekly excursions to Latitude where they get to jump, bounce and climb, they have also been practicing their swimming skills once a week at Reservoir Leisure Centre. The students engage with the VR Room once a week, and have rotations of the different trampolines around the school.

Students have been participating in literacy and numeracy lessons focusing on counting, number placement, data collection, sight reading, story books, and writing. They have participated in our Occupational Therapist lessons called 'Hartley knows I can write!' where students are learning letter angles and practicing their writing skills.

Room 22 students love turn taking and choosing their favorite songs during music, and playing social games such as Mr. Potato Head, Bowling, and sensory play.

They have done a great job this term, we can't wait to see them back in Term 2! Well done room 22!

STEAM - Reservoir

The STEAM building has all classrooms from Reservoir and Norris Bank visit on a weekly basis. Students are experiencing a wide variety of technology based on their skills and are supported by all staff.

Early Years students are interacting with touch and swiping a Interactive Whiteboard, Construction Corner and the Virtual Reality Room. Whilst Middle Years students are experiencing a mixture of OSMO Coding Apps, Bee-Bots, Lego Corner and Virtual Reality Room.

Students are given the opportunity in the Lego Corner to choose from a variety of construction activities including Lego, Duplo, K-nex, Magnetic Tiles and Cubes, Castle Wooden Block and Popiodes. This wide variety of construction caters for all student's needs.

NSA's Discovery Dome Incursion



Incursions such as this provide the students with new knowledge in a realistic and engaging setting. Through this interactive and immersive experience, the students viewed digital projections of the night sky including the stars, planets and major constellations.

The elements of the night sky were discussed in detail with colour and musical accompaniment providing information and wonderment for our students. It was fantastic to see all students enter the dome and experience a sense of WOW! The students enjoyed working on activities in the classroom that provided language experiences and consolidated their learning.


