What The Bouverie Centre can help with:

Families where a family member has

- a serious mental illness, including working with families where a parent has a mental
- experienced abuse or trauma including sexual and /or physical abuse
- an acquired brain injury
- conflict or other issues which have not improved with initial help

What The Bouverie Centre cannot help with:

- Individual counselling
- Court reports and current post separation
- Current domestic/family violence
- Educational or psychological assessments
- Acute crisis counseling
- Individual case management

What happens in a family appointment?
